

Fall Fest 2021 Guidelines

Fall Fest will be a hybrid event this year. Students will have the option to either participate at an in-person event OR submit a video.

Registration Deadline: November 1st, 2021

In-Person Event: Saturday, November 13th, 2021, Lipscomb University

Video Submission Deadline: November 13th, 2021

Critique sheets along with certificates will be mailed to teachers by December 1st, 2021

Fee: \$25 for all solo entries and \$5 for each person in an ensemble.

Fees are nonrefundable and the teacher must collect the fees and pay the registration fee online by visiting our Registration page at www.nashvilleareamusicteachersassociation.com and adding the amount of FallFest Registrations needed per student participating.

GUIDELINES AND GENERAL INFORMATION

FallFest is an opportunity for area students to perform one or two memorized pieces in a non-competitive setting. Each student receives a certificate and a critique. Ratings are optional. FallFest is held annually. Funds from this event support quality programs and workshops for NAMTA. There are no repertoire requirements.

Requirements

1. Students will perform one memorized solo or one duet (memory optional). One piece is preferred, but students may play two pieces if the total playing time is under the guideline of four or eight minutes. Students may enter both a solo and an ensemble.
2. All students must own an ORIGINAL copy of their music with the measures numbered at the beginning of each line. Due to the nature of the event this year, we are asking you submit an PDF of your score with your video submission.
3. Fees are nonrefundable and the teacher must collect the fees and send ONE check written to

NAMTA with the registration forms. See above information if google pay is preferred.

Rules for Festival

Please refer to the section in the TMTA/MTNA Guidelines and Applications booklet "Rules Applicable to All Auditions."

Eligibility

Students currently enrolled in school grades K-12 of any NAMTA or Guild teacher are eligible to enter. Adults are also eligible to participate.

Classifications

Piano Solo, Piano Duet, Strings Solo and Ensemble

Ratings/Results

Each student will receive an e-mailed performance assessment with or without rating as indicated on the application.

Performance Times

Time limits are four minutes for K-5 and eight minutes for grades 6-12. One piece is preferred, but students may play two pieces if the total playing time is under the guideline of four or eight minutes.

Application and Late Registration Fees

Any forms turned in after the deadline will incur a \$5 late fee, to be paid by the teacher.
